

MICHAEL N. HENDERSON



When Michael N. Henderson sat at the foot of his mother at the age of nine, inquiring about the spelling of her mother's maiden name, he couldn't have imagined that his curiosity would lead him on a journey that has lasted the majority of his life, and has led him to make history along the way.

A retired Lieutenant Commander from the U.S. Navy, Henderson's genealogy journey has lasted more than 30 years and led him to become the first African American in the state of Georgia inducted into the National Society, Sons of the American Revolution. He later became vice president, then president of the Button Gwinnett Chapter.

Through his research, Henderson has documented his Native American, French, French-Canadian, African, and German-Swedish ancestry as far back as 1657. His research has led to memberships in the following lineage societies:

- Order of the Founders of North America, 1492 1692

He is the author of Got Proof! My Genealogical Journey Through the Use of Documentation. The book has won several awards, including First Place in the 2015 Next Generation Indie Book Awards (Memoir) from the Independent Book Publishing Professionals Group, and Finalist in the 50th Georgia Author of the Year Awards (Memoir) by the Georgia Writers Association in 2014.

In Got Proof! My Genealogical Journey Through the Use of Documentation, Henderson captures the attention of genealogists, historians, and others interested in the complex social structure that developed during the French and Spanish colonial periods in Louisiana. He explores the forbidden relationships from which evolved the unique Creole culture. Revealing original documents from as far back as the 1770s, Henderson uses his own experiences as a family history researcher, as well as the insight of noted scholars, to reveal the methods, standards, and techniques used to prove his ancestry.

His research has been displayed in temporary exhibits at the National Archives at Atlanta, and at the Louisville International Airport.

He is a member of the Louisiana Historical Society, the American-French Genealogical Society, the Afro-American Historical and Genealogical Society, and the Georgia Genealogical Society.
